


Next Meeting – Saturday, March 24, 2018

Hands-On Workshop: "Plain Weave Isn't Plain Anymore" Special Time: Noon to 4pm

MEETING LOCATION

School of Visual Arts 133 West 21st Street between 6th and 7th Aves. Room 602C Noon to 4pm



All skill levels will find inspiration in this workshop. Come explore a variety of plain weave ideas for 2 to 8 shaft looms.

We will have a selection of 10 looms prepared for you. You'll be sampling plain weave variations, among them, **Spaced and Crammed** threading,

Checks, and color and weave techniques like **Log Cabin**. You'll

learn to wind a warp using space dyed yarns to create and weave **False Ikat**. Using a pickup stick, you'll sample **Leno** and learn to use specialized tools for making oriental knotted rugs, and try your hand at **Boutonne**, a plain weave variation that uses a knitting needle to make a looped pile pattern on a plain weave ground.





This is an opportunity to create and share ideas. Bring your imagination and color sense! Samples created in this workshop will be collected for the Guild Library for a Plain Weave Sample Book.

Peters Valley's upcoming Volunteer Weekend is Saturday/Sunday, April 14-15.

This will be an opportunity to spruce up the fibers studio and more importantly perform some muchneeded maintenance on our beautiful Macomber looms.

I think the plan will be primarily to wipe down the wood components of the loom with Howard's Feed and Wax and replace the torn aprons. We will also inspect the looms for other repair needs. I plan to buy small notebooks to attach to each loom so that each time someone uses a loom they can make note of what works/doesn't work so we can address those needs.

That weekend will also be an opportunity for us to meet Elisabeth Schwartz, PV's new full time, year-round studio manager whose responsibilities will include the Fibers Studio. I hope to meet with Elisabeth shortly to assess our supply requirements (rags, Howards, silicone spray, cotton for the aprons.) I will also try to dig out the notes I have from last summer on the conditions of the looms and see if there is anything we need from Macomber.
